

Largest Fuel Poverty Alliance Ever Assembled Calls for Energy Bill Revolution

1st August 2012

The biggest fuel poverty alliance ever assembled is calling for carbon tax to be recycled back to households to make their homes super-energy efficient.

The Energy Bill Revolution campaign has just recruited its 100th member. There are now 100 national organisations and businesses supporting the campaign, including major children's charities, environment groups, health and disability groups, unions, consumer groups and leading businesses.

Over the next 15 years, the Government will raise an average of £4 billion in carbon tax every year from the European Emissions Trading Scheme and the Carbon Floor Price. It is enough, for example, to provide £6,500 to 600,000 fuel poor homes every year to make their homes highly energy efficient. This is the only permanent way to drive down household energy bills and end fuel poverty. It could also quadruple carbon emission savings from households compared to the government's new energy efficiency policies and create up to 200,000 more jobs.

Research for the Energy Bill Revolution has revealed that fuel poverty could affect 9.1 million households by 2016, the year in which the Government has a target to eliminate fuel poverty. This is a potential rise of 40% which would increase the number of UK households in fuel poverty from one in four to one in three.

Ed Matthew, Director of Transform UK, the organisation which is coordinating the alliance campaign said:

"This is the biggest fuel poverty alliance that has ever been assembled. We are united by our conviction that the scourge of fuel poverty can be eradicated once and for all by recycling carbon tax to make homes super-energy efficient. If the Chancellor is even slightly serious about wanting to help households bring down their energy bills, then he should be jumping at this solution. It is time for an Energy Bill Revolution."
